ANARÉ V. HOLMES

NBC News hails Anaré V. Holmes as a "fearless firefighter" in its inaugural #Pride30 list of LGBTQ innovators, change makers and rising stars who are making the community proud. Holmes cut his teeth executing fiscally sound policy decisions as a former Advisor and Impact Council Member to the United Way's Children, Youth and Families' Needs Allocations Committee.

As an Impactor, Holmes influenced budgets of \$500,000 to \$3,000,000 to identify funding priorities and review grant allocation proposals targeting the needs of children, youth and families.
